In 2011, NCI launched an online CoP, Research to Reality (R2R), which engages community members at all levels of experience in an ongoing dialogue specifically around moving cancer control and implementation science into practice through dynamic communication and learning opportunities. This presentation will quantify NCI's experiences to date and provide specific examples of how researchers can accelerate uptake of their interventions by engaging on R2R in particular and virtual CoPs in general.</p>
