#### **A Brief History**

- 1999: Meharry-VICC Cancer Partnership started by Drs. Hal Moses (VICC) and Samuel E. Adunyah (Meharry) with NCI funded VICC Center Supplement Grant to Meharry
- 2001: Partnership received NCI U54 funding with Drs. Hal Moses and Samuel E. Adunyah as PIs
- 2006: Partnership U54 renewed and TSU brought in on subcontract to Meharry
- 2011: Partnership U54 renewed as Meharry-VICC-TSU (MVT) TRIAD Partnership with multiple-PI in each institution

- How to improve collaboration between VICC CTO and NGH CTO and Mehary Vanderbilt Alliance (MVA)?
- How to obtain adequate resources to conduct research with protected time for faculty to improve recruitment of clinical and research staff at Meharry Medical College?
- How to develop effective evaluation metrics for clinical trials success?

## Leveraging partnership cores and institutional resources:

- Identify therapeutic and non-therapeutic clinical trials that will benefit the population at NGH
- Enhance research that will address disparities for the NGH and catchment area population
- Increase accrual to research across the cancer care continuum

- implementation of healthcare interventions and policy to improve cancer care delivery and decrease cancer health disparities


#### **Specific Aims:**



# Background/ Overview




The Planning and Evaluation Core (PEC) will:

- Provide information to guide the investment of resources into projects, programs, and institutional-level strategies such as recruitment and leveraging of resources that support the goals of the partnership.


# Aim 1: Foster on-going coordination facilitated by the Administrative Core (AC), with the IAC and PSC to ensure the MVTCP is receiving expert feedback and guidance on cores, projects, and functionality of the MVT Cancer Partnership as a whole
