

 - Long-term Research Vision and Impact (2 pages)
 - Professional References (3 total)
- Field-specific search committees review applications
- Finalists are invited for interviews
- Open August 1-September 30, but start preparations early!!!



- In what research area(s) will you be known as a leading world expert?






The Match

- September 2016 Submitted Stadtman Application
- **December 2016** Notified of selection as Stadtman Finalist
- February 2017 Stadtman Seminar and Interview by DCEG
- March 2017 Request for DCEG-specific vision statement
- April/May 2017 Offered Stadtman TT position in DCEG
- June 2017 Appointed as Stadtman Investigator in LGS
- October 2017 Moved to ITEB (DCEG branch that hired me)
